





### procedure bylaw considerations

Restrictions over removal.

- Set a time limit for presenters
- Require pre-registration, including advance notice of discussion topic
- Require that topics relate to an agenda item
- Require that presenters are local residents (not applicable to nonprofits & societies)






### public engagement with intent

Not all engagement is equal. Engaging for the sake of engaging is the wrong decision.

Engagement needs to be meaningful, with the potential to have an impact on municipal decisions or process.



### engagement with intent

- 1 Why are you engaging?
- 2 What are you prepared to change?
- How will engagement results be used in the decision-making process?
- 4 How will residents' involvement be maintained?



### public engagement

#### **INFORM**

Provide residents
with information
pertinent to an
engagement
process, including
insight into their
own level of
involvement.

#### CONSULT

Obtain public feedback on analysis, alternatives, and/ or a decision to be brought before Council.

#### INVOLVE

Work directly with the public throughout a process, creating consistent engagement.

#### COLLABORATE

Partner with the public at every level of the decision-making process, including more complete input from residents.

#### **EMPOWER**

Place final decision-making in the hands of the public.



# increasing participation

- meet residents where they are
- make things easy to understand
- show the value of participation
- sensibly incentivize affordability
- establish a 'control group'





## engaging through controversy

### council's role

Empower effective communications and bolstered public engagement:

- Advocate for Public Engagement with Intent
  - Undergo review of current engagement efforts to determine future needs, including capacity and costing
- Review Public Participation Policy for intent
- De velop public-facing Public Engagement Framework
- Actively communicate with residents within your governance role
- Budget in reflection of what you want to see in communications

- Will my actions comply with conduct expectations?
- 2 Am I speaking in an official capacity?
- 3 Is there a conflict of interest, bias, or personal vendetta?
- Is it in the best interest of the municipality as a whole?
- Will this reflect negatively on my colleagues?
- 6 Can I justify my actions and statements?
- 7 Am I doing the right thing?



# building trust through crisis

Never waste a good emergency.

Crises provide an opportunity to:

- Build trust with residents
- Develop a relationship with the community
- Maintain trust moving forward

### reputation management

In addition to building trust with your residents, there is a 'trust' factor related to your municipality's reputation.

- Evaluate what's being said about the organization/community externally
- Identify and evaluate those outside conversations' impact to the municipality
- Proactively identify the potential of reputational damage
  - o Design and execute plans to mitigate any potential impacts, as appropriate
